Pupil Premium money has been used to ensure that all classes have one teacher and one NVQ3. All Year Groups have an additional Teaching Assistant. Together they ensure that all children receive Targeted and Focussed support so that the gap between FSM and Non FSM is closing.

Pupil Premium money has been used to sustain staffing levels so that all year groups have at least one additional support member of staff so that small group and 1:1 teaching and support may be organised. - Significantly below for Mathematics
- Roughly in line for Reading and Writing
